

## COVID 19 Policy and Precautions for Westies on the Water Productions

Westies on the Water (WotW) will comply with the Gunterville State Park Lodge COVID Policy. In addition, WotW hereby documents procedures specific to the type of workshops we are offering.

### Current Gunterville State Park Lodge Policy:

- Hand sanitizer stations will be available at the door and spaced around the ballroom.
- Attendance will be limited to 150 people which is 50% occupancy.
- The registration staff will be wearing masks.
- The registration line will be spaced at 6 ft.
- Entry to the Lodge will require masks.

### Additional Policy Governing Westies on the Water Productions:

- Reduce potential for interactions by adopting a streamlined schedule.
- Limit the entire event to one ballroom.
- Eliminate Jack and Jill - **No WSDC competitions.**
- Limit competition to 'just for fun' strictly swing contests.
- Limit entry to 150 participant maximum.
- Send out a health screening survey prior to the event.
- Implement mandatory temperature checks at registration.
  - No one with a temperature of 100 degrees or more will be allowed to enter. A refund may be issued in this case if entry fee has already been paid.
- STRONGLY ENCOURAGE the use hand sanitizer between every dance. Hand sanitizer will be placed liberally throughout the ballroom.
- Provide for optional rotation during the workshops. We will not have mandatory rotating during the classes. We realize the number of leaders and followers are never the same. If you can arrange to have a dance partner that is ideal.
- Enforce social distancing during class. Maintain 6 feet from other pairs.

- For social dancing, we will provide wrist bands to “announce” your comfort level of participation. The three levels will be:
    1. I am only dancing with my partner.
    2. I am open to dancing with everyone, but only if you wear a mask.
    3. I am comfortable dancing with anyone, with or without a mask.
- Social dancing at Westies on the Water will be “at your own risk”. We encourage wearing masks during social dancing, but realize that it is an aerobic activity and a mask may hinder breathing.

Please be patient, as we navigate the risks of setting up an event in an unprecedented time. We are trying to make dance accessible to everyone. We do understand that every participant has a different comfort level in participation and we honor that.
